FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Welcome back. I do hope everyone had a relaxing and enjoyable break. I hope the same for all of our families. This term has started incredibly well and is filling up with excursions, camp (Year 5) and incursions. A reminder that we have two public holidays in the next two weeks – ANZAC Day and Labour Day.

ANZAC Day is huge on our school community calendar. Our school's commemoration service is next Wednesday, commencing at 1:55pm in the PAC. Second break will be earlier on this day to accommodate this important assembly. All families are welcome to attend.

Our school's **Yarning Circle** was completed over the break. We are incredibly grateful to Thomas and the Team and The Y for their successful grant application. This space is available to all for use. Over the term, we will learn from our Indigenous partners more about the protocols and use of yarning circles. The use of a Yarning Circle is an important process within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture. It has been used by Indigenous peoples from around the world for centuries to learn from a collective group, build respectful relationships and to preserve and pass on cultural knowledge.



Basketball courts and handball courts on the oval are also being upgraded. Details and photos will be provided upon completion. Last term's facilities focus was huge. The senior water cooler particularly proving very popular with students. We have prioritised the toilet blocks and Year 4 and Year 5 buildings for the next round of infrastructure funding.




CHAPPY HUT OPEN FOR STUDENTS – FROM WEEK 2


SOCIAL MEDIA
